**General Rules**

1. Entries may be made Friday, March 19 from 4 to 10 pm and Saturday, March 20 from 6 to 10 am. All exhibitors must be off the floor by 10:30am. This rule will be strictly enforced.
2. Entry cards for exhibits will be available at the show and may also be obtained in advance from the show chairman.
3. Entries, awards, and ribbons may not be removed until 4 pm Sunday.

**Rules for Horticulture Exhibits**

Entries

4. All classes are open to anyone who grows daffodils except where specified otherwise.
5. Any information on an entry tag, including the exhibitor's number, which could compromise the anonymity of the exhibitor must be concealed during judging.
6. An exhibitor may make as many entries as desired in any class, provided each entry is a different cultivar or species or an entirely different collection of cultivars and/or species.
7. All blooms in the Horticultural Division must have been grown in the open by the exhibitor. Miniatures and daffodils grown and shown in their containers may be grown in protected areas.
8. Wedging material and containers for cut flower exhibits will be furnished by the show committee. Except for daffodils grown and shown in their containers, no daffodil foliage is permitted.
9. All collections of five or more stems must be exhibited with each cultivar or species in a separate container.

Labeling

10. Each cultivar or species must be correctly labeled with name and division. Originator's name must appear on the label in American bred classes except seedlings shown by the originator.
11. Exhibits which are not named or are incorrectly named will not be judged. Correct classification and labeling shall be the responsibility of the exhibitor. Exception - Section K, Unidentified Daffodils.
12. No label may be changed, specimen added, removed, altered, or substituted after judging has begun or after an award has been placed.

## **Rules for Horticulture Exhibits (con't)**

### Intermediates, Miniatures, and Seedlings

13. An intermediate daffodil is a standard daffodil in divisions 1, 2, 3, 4, or 11 having a single floret whose diameter is typically greater than 50 through 80 mm. Intermediate daffodils may be entered in classes for standard daffodils as well as classes reserved for intermediate daffodils.
14. Miniature daffodils may be shown only in classes for miniatures. A miniature daffodil is any cultivar or species on the current ADS Approved List of Miniatures. Also, any named or numbered diminutive daffodil which appears graceful, with all of its parts proportionately small, may be exhibited in Miniature classes and is eligible for all ADS awards, except that only numbered seedlings shown by the originator are eligible for the ADS Miniature Rose Ribbon. The judges may decline to judge any exhibit containing an unapproved miniature they consider too large for these classes.
15. Blooms of seedlings may be exhibited in all classes for named cultivars. ALL SEEDLINGS MUST BE IDENTIFIED BY A NUMBER DESIGNATION ASSIGNED BY THE ORIGINATOR. If the exhibitor is not the originator, the name of the originator must be included as a part of the identification.

### Awards

16. Each stem in an exhibit of cut flowers receiving an ADS Award must score 90 or more on the appropriate ADS Scale of Points.
17. Only one first, one second, and one third-place award may be given in each class. Honorable Mention awards may also be given if merited but only if first-place, second-place, and third-place ribbons have been awarded. First, second, third, and honorable mention awards may be withheld by the judges if in their opinion the exhibit is not worthy. If a blue ribbon (first place) has been awarded in a class eligible for an ADS ribbon, the ADS award may not be withheld.
18. The decisions of the judges are final. If an error is discovered in an exhibit after completion of judging, any award placed thereon (ADS, Special, or Ribbon) shall be forfeited by the exhibitor. If an error is discovered before the judging is completed, the class must be re-judged.

### Miscellaneous

19. The Show Committee reserves the right to subdivide classes by cultivar or color code when there are three or more worthy exhibits of the same cultivar or color code and if a sufficient number of worthy exhibits are left in the class. Species classes may be subdivided by their botanical sections.
20. The Royal Horticultural Society system of classification will be used. The labeling authority is "Daffodils to Show and Grow" as amended each year in the December ADS Daffodil Journal supplemented by the latest printout of the ADS "Daffodil Data Bank".

## **American Daffodil Society Awards**

Gold Ribbon	Best standard daffodil in Horticulture Division excluding Container-Grown and Historic Sections.
White Ribbon	Best set of three stems of one standard cultivar or species excluding entries in the Historic Section.
Rose Ribbon	Best standard seedling exhibited by its originator.
Purple Ribbon	Best collection of five different standard daffodils in Classes 199 through 214 and Class 247 (Intermediate).
Maroon Ribbon	Best collection of five different standard cultivars, one stem each. Reverse bicolor. Any division or divisions. (Class 215).
Red -White-Blue Ribbon	Best collection of five different standard cultivars, one stem each of American Breeding (Class 216).
Bozievich Ribbon	Best collection of twelve different cultivars and/or species of standard daffodils from at least four RHS divisions (Class 217).
Havens Ribbon	Best collection of twelve different cultivars of standard daffodils from at least three divisions from RHS divisions 5 through 10 (class 218).
Throckmorton Ribbon	Best collection of fifteen cultivars and/or species of standard daffodils from fifteen different RHS classifications, each labeled with name and complete classification (Class 219).
Quinn Award	Silver Medal or Ribbon for a collection of twenty-four different cultivars and/or species of standard daffodils from at least five divisions. The Medal may be won only once by an exhibitor in all ADS Shows where offered. A former winner may exhibit in this class but may receive only the Quinn Ribbon. Open only to ADS members (Class 220).
Miniature Gold Ribbon	Best miniature daffodil in the Horticultural Division, excluding Container-Grown and Historic Sections.
Miniature White Ribbon	Best set of three stems of miniature daffodils.
Miniature Rose Ribbon	Best miniature seedling exhibited by its originator.
Lavender Ribbon	Best collection of five miniature daffodils excluding entries for the Red-White-Blue Ribbon (Classes 192, 193, and 194).

Miniature Red-White-Blue Ribbon	Best collection of five different miniature cultivars, one stem each of American breeding (Class 195)
Aqua Ribbon	Best collection of nine miniature cultivars and/or species, one stem each from at least three different RHS divisions (Class 196)
Roberta C. Watrous Award	Silver medal or ribbon for a collection of twelve different cultivars and/or species of miniature daffodils from at least three divisions. This medal may be won only once by an exhibitor in all ADS Shows where offered. A former winner may exhibit in this class but may receive only the Watrous Ribbon. Open only to ADS members (Class 197).
ADS Premier Miniature Collection Ribbon	Twenty Four Cultivars and/or species, one stem each, from at least five RHS Divisions. Open only to ADS members (Class 198)
ADS Three Miniatures By Hybridizer Ribbon	Best set of three different miniature daffodils hybridized and originated their exhibitor. Open only to ADS members. (Class 256)
ADS Six Miniatures By Hybridizer Ribbon	Best collection of six miniature daffodils hybridized and originated by their exhibitor. Open only to ADS members. (Class 257)
ADS Twelve Miniatures By Hybridizer Ribbon	Best collection of twelve miniature daffodils hybridized by and originated by their exhibitor. Open only to ADS members. (Class 258)
Youth Best Bloom Ribbon	Best Daffodil exhibited in the YOUTH Section.

## **Section G Container Grown Daffodils**

Blooms are to be grown in and exhibited in a container or pot. All bulbs in any one container shall be of the same cultivar or species. Container-grown daffodils may be grown in protected areas. No bloom or exhibit in this section shall be eligible for any ADS award other than the ADS awards for container grown daffodils. Rule #19 is extended to permit subdividing classes by daffodil divisions.

## **Section H Historic Daffodils**

This section is open to all cultivars (i.e., not species) introduced or in gardens before 1940. All cultivars shall be labeled with name, division number, and year of registration (or introduction) as listed in the ADS Daffodil Data Bank. No bloom in this section shall be eligible for any ADS award other than the ADS ribbon for Pre-1940 Cultivar. Rule #19 is extended to permit subdividing Classes 224 to 233 by registration date and Class 234 and 235 by division or registration date.

Identification of all blooms in the next three classes, both named and numbered, must be concealed until after judging. To facilitate the selection of candidates for the Miniature Rose Ribbon, seedlings are to be marked by a check on the card facing the judges.

Note: Youth designs are judged as above, but require only 90 instead of 95 points for Youth Design Award.

#### Rules:

1. Plant materials used need not have been grown by the designer, but the design must be the work of the exhibitor.
2. Mark all containers.
3. Some fresh plant material must be used in all designs.
4. No artificial flowers, foliage, fruit or vegetables are permitted.
5. FRESH plant material may not ever be treated.
6. Accessories permitted, however, must be subordinate.
7. Plant material must dominate.
8. All classes open to anyone except beginner class.
9. No arrangement accepted over 30 inch width, unless otherwise specified.
10. **NGC** standard system of judging and awarding will be used.

#### Awards:

Section A - BETTY ALLISON PERPETUAL TROPHY. Daffodils must predominate in design. A background will be provided. Class 1, 2, 3 Size limited to 30" wide X 32" tall. The background may be left plain or covered as the designer chooses.

Section B - NGC TRICOLOR AWARD. All plant material used in design MUST BE FRESH. Must score 95. Must have three classes with a minimum of four entries in each class. CLASSES 4, 5, 6  
**Classes 4 and 5 must include daffodils.**

Section C - NGC DESIGNERS CHOICE AWARD. The exhibitor has complete freedom to choose plant materials and other components for this award, within NGC policies. Schedule is not permitted to specify type of plant material, or components to be used, except that a plant society's featured plant material may be required by schedule. Must score 95. Must have three classes with a minimum of four entries in each class. Classes 7, 8, 9.

Section D - NGC PETITE AWARD. Some fresh plant material in each design. Not more than five inches in height, width or depth Must score 95. Must have three classes with a minimum of four entries in each class. Classes 10, 11, 12.

Section E - Beginner: Anyone who has won not more than five blue ribbons in a standard flower show. Classes 13, 14  
**Classes 13 and 14 must include daffodils.**
